\*Depending on the size of your graphic, it may come in one piece or sectioned off into two or more pieces. The following steps show instructions for graphics with multiple pieces. If your graphic comes in just one piece, all or part of some of the steps will not apply and may be skipped. Please read the instructions carefully.

## YOU WILL NEED:

- Tape Measure/Ruler
- A Drawing Utensil:
- Pencil
- (if applying to a wall)
- Dry Erase Marker
- (if applying to window) Grease Pencil
- (wall or window application)


## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS






Prepare the surface the graphic will be applied to, making sure it is clean and dry. You may use water or alcohol. Do not use amonia based products like windex®

STEP 2




(Skip this step if 1 pc graphic) On a clean, flat surface (like a table) arrange the pieces to form the finished image. The edges of the graphic pieces should be flush against each other.

STEP 3




Measure the width of the graphic and divide by two to find the center. Mark the center of your graphic on the transfer tape with your pencil/marker.

STEP 4




Plan where you want to place the graphic. Using the measurements taken in Step 3, lightly mark the width and center point. Then, using a level, lightly draw a level line that will help you apply the graphic nice and straight. PRO TIP: Use low tack painters tape on the walls first, then make your marks on the tape.

STEP 6



Gently pull off the transfer tape. If any part of the vinyl graphic starts to come off with the tape, put the transfer tape back down, go over it again with the squeegee, and then gently try to remove the tape again.

STEP 5



Peel the backing paper off and, using the marks you drew in Step 4 as guides, use light pressure on the outer edges of the graphic to arrange it on the surface. If the graphic came in multiple pieces, start with the piece with the center mark from Step 3, then work outward arranging the remaining piece(s). When you are satisfied with the graphic placement, adhere it to the surface with the squeegee using firm strokes that go from the center to the edges.

STEP 7



Erase the guide marks you made. Your graphic installation is now finished.
